Dear resident, business owner, community leader, or interested stakeholder:

The Town of Phillipston is partnering with The Montachusett Regional Planning Commission to offer this timely two-part workshop which will bring together community members like you to comprehensively identify and prioritize steps to reduce risk and improve resilience throughout Phillipston. The workshops will help guide comprehensive community resilience planning and hazard mitigation efforts.

The primary purpose is to better understand the connections between climate-influenced natural hazards, local vulnerabilities and potential impacts, and to develop a strategic plan for climate resilience through adaptive measures and mitigation actions.

The Workshops Objectives are as follows:

- Evaluate strengths and vulnerabilities of residents, infrastructure, and natural resources.
- Develop and prioritize resilient actions for the Town, local organizations, institutions, businesses, private citizens, neighborhoods, and community groups.
- Identify immediate opportunities to advance actions that reduce the impact of hazards and increase community resiliency.
